Know the history and geography of Canada and have a general understanding of world history and geography. g. Understand Canada's political, social, and economic systems within a global context. h. Respect the cultural diversity, the religious diversity, and the common values of Canada. i. Demonstrate desirable personal characteristics such as respect, responsibility, fairness, honesty, caring, loyalty and commitment to democratic ideals. j. Recognize the importance of personal well-being and appreciate how family and others contribute to that well-being. k. Know the basic requirements of an active, healthy lifestyle. l. Understand and appreciate literature, the arts and the creative process. m. Research an issue thoroughly and evaluate the credibility and reliability of information sources. n. Demonstrate critical and creative thinking skills in problem solving and decision making. o. Demonstrate competence in using information technologies. p. Know how to work independently and as part of a team. q. Manage time and other resources needed to complete a task. r. Demonstrate initiative, leadership, flexibility, and persistence. s.
